## "Learning, Living, Sharing the Gospel"

"If in this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied" (1 Cor 15.19).

What do you hope for? Many of the things we hope for God has graciously given us already. For many years I hoped to be a husband and father. Today, I rejoice with all my being, thanking God our Father for fulfilling my hope and placing me in the family He created. Many of you share that same joy, while a few of you are still waiting.

Other hopes have yet come to pass for each of us. (I'm running out of time to win a 'Tour de France') and sometimes we are tempted to despair they may never be fulfilled at all. What do you hope for today? Are you hoping your unbelieving child, grandchild or spouse will return to church and hear the Gospel? Maybe you hope God will heal your heart disease, blindness or diabetes. Some may still be hoping for that job that will support the family while fulfilling the deep longings of the heart—God's gift of vocation.

November is the month we celebrate "All Saints". Every baptized believer is a saint, but the Holy Scriptures provide us examples of a few extraordinary saints for us to imitate. For all their mis-steps, sins and downright un-belief at times, these saints are singled out because their God given faith raised them to the level of *heroes: "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for,"* the Holy Spirit testifies in Hebrews 11, *"[Faith is] the conviction of things not seen. [2] For by it the people of old received their commendation.* The writer of Hebrews goes on to describe the hopes and faith of Abel, Noah, Abraham, Sarah, Moses and other giants in the Kingdom of God.

Then after describing all the great works God enabled them to do, the Holy Spirit concludes: "*These all died in faith, not having received the things promised, but having seen them and greeted them from afar, and having acknowledged that they were strangers and exiles on the earth . . . . "And all these, though commended through their faith, did not receive what was promised"* (Heb 11.1-3, 13, 39).

So what's going on here? Is God playing some kind of mean trick? Is God lying in St. John 16.23 when He promises to give us all things we ask in Jesus' name?

Hebrews 11 explains that God promised His saints of old, something better, something God wanted to share with you and me, "that apart from us they should not be made perfect" (v.40).

That 'something better' is God's own Son, our Savior from death and hell. The 'something better' God wants to give us is eternal life with Jesus and all the saints in unsurpassable joy and glory that gets better each day for all eternity without end!

St. Paul describes it this way in his letter to the hopeful saints of Corinth: "For the Son of God, Jesus Christ, whom we proclaimed among you, is not Yes and No, but in him it is always Yes" (1 Cor 1.19).

The answer to all of Abel's hopes and prayers, the promise made to Abraham, the Promised Land promised to Moses, the Kingdom promised to David and all your hopes too are answered with a resounding 'YES' in Christ Jesus, the Lord of the universe who *loves you*. Better than winning the Tour de France and even better than the treasure of our spouse and children, is the fulfillment of all good

things in Christ Jesus.

Your fulfillment is *now* because Christ lives in you through the faith creating waters of Holy Baptism. Your fulfillment is *yet to come*, on that day God makes all things new, taking away forever your ability and even your desire to sin, God Himself wiping away your every tear and disappointment as your loving Father seats you with the saints at the wedding feast of the Lamb where all hopes are forever, joyously answered 'YES' in Christ Jesus.
