UNITY IN THE COMMUNITY

First, a comment on our review of The Revelation. I am so pleased with the number of you who have engaged in this study. There is no doubt we are going rather quickly through this wonderful teaching. That, of course, is an understatement! Working through The Revelation in seven weeks is a challenge. But, you have been up to the challenge!

And rightly so. Listen to the promise that opens the teaching of the Lord Jesus to us: "Blessed is the one who reads aloud the words of this prophetic teaching, and blessed are those who hear it being read, and blessed are those who pay attention to what is written in it" (Rev. 1:3). Listen to the promise that closes the Teaching: "Blessed is the one who keeps the words of the prophecy of this book" (Rev. 22:7). No other book of the Scriptures makes such promises!

Why did we set out to study The Revelation together? To draw us toward and around Jesus; to be united in our community around the Word of God. Unity among the Christian community matters. In fact, when reading through Paul's letters to the churches, unity is one of the consistent and significant themes. In my experience, there is nothing on earth like a Christian community united together in Christ.

Let's consider this a moment. Unity in the Christian congregation matters because of the Unity of the Trinity. We confess our God as three Persons that remain one Being. One of the ancient church fathers – Gregory of Nazianzus – described the relationship of the Persons as "giving preference to each other, as giving glory to each other, as having participation in each other."

What a glorious description of unity within diversity! Each Person of the Trinity is unique – we know them as Father, Son, Holy Spirit – yet they dwell together as a complete and total unity. My point here is not to explain the Trinity, but to remind us that the Body of Christ, the Communion of Saints, the fellowship of the redeemed, the holy Christian Church is utterly and fully influenced by the Trinitarian Way of Life Together.

Take note of how Jesus treats those who belong to Him throughout the Revelation. He treats each one with awareness, dignity and respect, openness and honesty; relating to each with conversation and recognition. Seems to me the Blessing noted above is for those who "pay attention to what is written" in the Revelation.

Wonderfully, graciously, amazingly and lovingly, the "King of kings" and "Lord of lords" treats those He loves as described above. We who are blessed with the "forgiveness of sins and the gifting of the Holy Spirit" (Acts 2) can join Him in living with one another in a similar way.

May the Blessed Trinity keep and protect you always!
