COMING TOGETHER FOR THE SUMMER

Last month, I emphasized unity. This is important. Well, actually unity is critical and vital to anything and everything that Jesus wants to do through us. Listen to Jesus pray: "... that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me" (John 17:23). Jesus is clear; Christian unity is for a real purpose – so that the world may know the love of the Father.

In my work with congregations over the years, helping them to consider reasons why they are not growing as the LORD intends, I have noticed the utter lack of unity as a major cause. In some cases, I've observed what I call a "manufactured unity." This is where the people do everything they can to look united while holding the bitterness below the surface, keeping it secret as best they can. On rare occasions, I've experienced unity, real unity, observable unity, Holy Spirit-unity; a Christian community that had become "perfectly one."

Such a community is contagious ... and dangerous! Contagious because every person longs for such a community that both receives and shares the love of God in both word and deed. Dangerous because this community attracts the attention of the evil one who works desperately to conquer it. Like a broken cup, a fractured congregation finds it difficult to receive the Water of Life and is unable to pour such Water out for others in a way they can receive.

As you can tell, I'm an advocate or and for congregational unity. One of my ministry-questions has long been: "how is such unity cultivated?"

I firmly believe that Jesus has given us the answer: "I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me..." (John 17:20-23).

Such unity ... the Holy Spirit sort of unity ... is cultivated through the Word of the Father given through the Son to the apostles and learned by us. All of us! From the youngest to the most experienced. This is what Jesus prayed for on the night he was betrayed ... and still prays! We are even privileged to join him in praying "Our Father, who art in the heavens ..."

For the summer months here in beautiful Steamboat Springs, let's give ourselves two opportunities for this Word of the Father to be learned among us. First, our adult Bible Study every Sunday is working together to move beyond studying about the earliest Christian community to learning the reasons why they were such an amazing community of believers. You can join us each week as we explore and apply the lessons of Acts.

Second, many of you have received copies of Grace Upon Grace: Spirituality for Today by John Kleinig. Continue reading and re-reading. We will gather at some point toward late summer to celebrate what we have all received: "grace upon grace" (John 1:16). It is my prayer that Jesus' High Priestly Prayer would be found among us.


