Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Hallelujah!

Easter, celebrated this year on April 1<sup>st</sup>, is more than a one-day experience. Resurrection is an on-going truth, a present reality, influencing and transforming throughout our lives. Through the Resurrection of Jesus, thought to have taken place on April 9, 0030, the New Creation was launched. There is now a new Ruler in cosmos.

Each Sunday after Easter is an important reflection and reminder of the present-day reality of this cosmos-changing event. We explored the "lavish feast" that the Creator has prepared for those who come through the resurrection-to-Life. We considered the real, practical difference that "forgiveness" brings into the cosmos. We pondered the significance and necessity of the Scriptures in the lives of the faithful. We relished in the Good Shepherd, the caretaker and watchful protector of our lives. Last week, we observed how "love" draws our lives together and grounds our life in Christ. The imagery of love continues this Sunday under the theme "Love Made Visible."

There are seven Sundays during the Easter Festival. In between the sixth and seventh Sundays comes the 40<sup>th</sup> day after Easter. This year, this day lands on May 10<sup>th</sup>. This is Ascension Day. You can read the story in Acts 1. This very special day, though hardly ever celebrated, is the day the Son of God returns to the heavenly glory from whence He came. Having worked 40 days to ensure the disciples and all His followers were convinced of the very fact of His resurrection, He returns to His Father's side.

This enables many remarkable events: The Coronation of Jesus as the rightful Ruler of the Cosmos; the battle to refuse Him this well-deserved honor; the defeat and removal of the devil from his accusatory place and work (casting him to the earth); and the affirmation of the Church of Jesus Christ as His representatives on earth. This all leads up to the final event of this "10-day" time frame: Pentecost, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit ... God with His people-on-earth once again ... the heavens and earth reunited!

This year, Pentecost is on May 20<sup>th</sup>. On this day we remember and rejoice in the arrival of the Holy Spirit among Jesus' people. On this day, we will say, "Christ is Risen ... the Holy Spirit Has Come!"

How do we remember and rejoice in the presence and work of the Holy Spirit among us? This year, beginning the first Sunday of June, we will begin a summer series on "The Fruit of the Spirit." What happens in our congregation and our personal lives as the Holy Spirit works among us through His Word? He produces fruit ... His Fruit ... in our lives. Our daily-lives and community-life ripen along the flavors of the Fruit of the Spirit. I'm looking forward to summer!
