Resurrection Greetings to my Forever-Family!

Over the past week or so, many people have asked me, "how was your Easter?" My response is "Great! And it is still great!" With their puzzled look, I know I must tell them what I mean. "I mean that while Easter day is done and gone; the reality of Resurrection is still an ongoing reality in my life." That leads to a "I get it" look on their face.

Remembering that Resurrection is an ongoing reality is important.

Let me ask you a question: "what did you do the day after Easter?" I could also ask: "what did you do the afternoon of Easter Sunday?" I would venture to guess that 100% of us headed back into our daily lives, doing what we do with family and friends, coworkers and neighbors. All of us went home; some of us went to work; many of us enjoyed an Easter feast with our family. In other words, we celebrated Resurrection and headed back into normal, everyday life.

Personally, I drove to Iowa to deal with my parent's home and household goods. So, I spent Easter Monday in the car, driving. Once at my destination, I worked with three of my siblings to sort, distribute, decide, pack, move and deal with the accumulated "stuff-of-life" for a couple ... our parents ... that had been married 63 years.

How is what I did a remembering that Resurrection is an ongoing reality? How was what you did on or after Easter a remembering of the present reality of Resurrection? I suspect many would think what I did after Easter was mundane, common, ordinary and "nothing special." After all, like you, I simply headed back into daily life.

I would disagree that what I did was mundane, common, ordinary and "nothing special." At the same time, I would argue that what you did was none of these as well. What we all did was extraordinary! The Resurrection of Jesus Messiah clearly means that everything we do in Faith is important, has meaning and is bathed with Divine Purpose. Here's how the Holy Spirit – the same power that raised Jesus from death – speaks to us: "Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain" (1 Corinthians 15:58 ESV).

The "therefore" shows that Paul is drawing a conclusion based on the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus. The conclusion he draws is that His Resurrection grounds and covers all that we do in the work of the Lord, knowing full well that what we do is not in vain, i.e. has meaning and purpose. My efforts with siblings – and your efforts with family, friends, coworkers and neighbors, etc. – express an abiding love for our God and Lord by offering a practical, loving service to those around us.

Now that's something to ponder. That's why, in part, Easter is ongoing!


