"What is the good life?" and "Who is the genuinely good person?"


These two questions have come before us in the past several weeks. As I have suggested, these two questions dominate your life, my life, all lives, everyone. These are the two questions that quietly – sometimes loudly – motivate your daily actions, inspire your relationships, stimulate your responses to various issues and arouse your passions and desires. These two questions, whether we realize it or not, run our lives!

"What" or "where" you have lunch today is a response to these two questions. "Who" or "when" or "how" you interact with another person is a response to these two questions. "Why" you do what you do in the next hour is a response to these two questions.

These two questions are of such significance that the earliest chapters of the Bible offer God's directives on them; Jesus' earliest efforts in making disciples ponders them; Paul's greatest letter – Romans – diagnosis the issues of our failed responses to them and offers insight and encouragement for developing appropriate responses to them; even the final chapters of the Bible return us to these two questions.

Graciously, and thankfully, the Scriptures offer us help and guidance in our daily pursuit of living our everyday lives with meaningful response to "what is the good life" and "who is the genuinely good person." I have developed the Bible's "matrix" for living as we were created to live and recreated to pursue. I will continue to develop this "matrix" in the weeks to come.

Put simply, every human being lives "before" their Creator and "with" other people. Living "before" the Creator makes us "creatures" in need of His resources. Before our God we are *passive recipients* of all that is needful for life. Living "with" other people makes us *active participants* in sharing the resources we have received. Each of us lives with a "vertical" God-to-human relationship and with "horizontal" human-to-human relationships.



This image looks like an upside-down cross. When Jesus invites me to "daily take up your cross and follow Me," I know that He intends for me to stop answering these two questions in my own ways and learn to answer these two questions in His way. The difficult part is that "taking up my cross" sounds a lot like "death," not something I want to pursue or experience. But who would have guessed, once we have "given up our lives for Him," that He would turn and give us back His Life to share with others?

My fellow-redeemed brothers and sisters, it is His Life that makes us what we are; it is His Life that motivates us; it is His Life that inspires us; it is His Life that is "genuinely good;" it is His Life that is our Life! Hope to see you soon!
