Whenever I work with people who want to know the Lord through the Word of God, I encourage them to begin asking questions. This is certainly not a profound comment on my part. We've all been encouraged to ask questions since very early on in our education. Each of us has flourished in our chosen career(s) by learning to ask more and better questions. When we wanted to learn something new – either because we had to or because we wanted to – we started by asking questions.

Who? What? When? Why? How? These are the basic questions that motivate our lives, guide our decisions, drive our economy and make things happen.

Jesus asked questions ... lots of questions. In fact, one meaningful devotional approach is to read Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, searching out the questions Jesus asked, and answering His questions from our contemporary perspective. This proved to be a fascinating devotional journey.

Let me help you get started. The first question we have recorded that Jesus asks is, "Why were you searching for me?" What a great question! How would you answer Jesus' question to you? What are you doing as a part of your search for Jesus? Where is Jesus that anticipates you are searching for Him? I know these are further questions, but they help me develop a better answer.

Throughout the month of February, I asked you to share questions that you'd like to consider with the congregation on Sunday morning. Thanks to all who have submitted your questions! We've got some good topics to consider in the weeks ahead.

Last Sunday focused on the topic of "temptation." We pondered most of the verses in the New Testament that bring up temptation. How do we explain the evil in the world today? We were reminded that temptations are common in the world, that the Satan uses them to get us to question God's Word, that other people can be the source of temptation and that Jesus has been tempted in every way that we are, making Him worthy of all our attention.

This Sunday, March 8, we'll pick up the topic of "faith." Like with "temptation," this is a significant topic, important for our daily and eternal lives. And, just like with the topic of "temptation," there is a good chance that you'll come up with more questions.
