On Easter Sunday, we concluded a series on the Revelation. On Easter Sunday, we began a series on the Revelation. Before Easter, we pondered life as we live it in our world, discovering what the Lord Jesus teaches us about living in troubled times. After Easter, we are pondering life as it is possible to live it in the real world with the New Creation as our goal and guide.

From what I can tell, many have "spiritualized" the Resurrection of Jesus. Too many Christians cling to the Resurrection with a devotional mindset, believing it – even with their questions – celebrating on a Sunday, and thinking it primarily significant for some future life. This is not the way of the Gospels.

The Gospels reveal the Resurrection as taking place in and working with "space, time, and matter." This is Good News. The world of space, time, and matter is where real people live, where real communities happen, where difficult decisions are made, where schools nurture, where hospitals support. It is in the real world of space, time, and matter where governments and business owners are established to benefit the wider community. All of life is lived in the world of space, time, and matter.

At the same time, the Church is being renewed by the message of Resurrection to enter and engage the world of space, time, and matter. We are here as God's claim upon the whole world, the place where God's Kingdom and Authority are established, and the presence and power of the Spirit is made visible. What does this mean for us?

The congregation that affirms all *space* is sacred knows that our sanctuary is not an escape from the world but is a beachhead for God's work in the world, propelling us into the work of enhancing the beauty, well-being, and functionality of God's Creation.

The congregation that affirms all *time* is holy knows the appropriate rhythms of worship and work, retirement and involvement, relaxation and responsibility in the shaping of public life for the common good and health of neighborhoods and environments.

The congregation that affirms all *matter* is grasped by the transforming, renewing presence and power of God will not just seek to celebrate the coming of God in and through the sacramental elements but will also work to make a meaningful, material difference in the lives of others.

This is what we are learning throughout the Easter season. As I mentioned last Sunday, we are discovering the Easter-Egg-Hunt way of life in Jesus! See you soon!
